## Auburn's City Manager Announces Resignation

Today Douglas Selby confirmed that he has tendered his resignation as Auburn's city manager. He cited personal reasons for his resignation and stated that he has enjoyed the opportunity to serve the city and citizens for the past four years. "There is never a good time for a city to lose its chief executive and in a city as dynamic as Auburn there are always projects and issues in progress that pass on to the new leader. I am fortunate to have worked with a dedicated and professional city staff and am confident they will continue to provide excellent service to residents and visitors," said Selby.

Selby noted achievements in infrastructure updating, savings from new union contracts, and improving the financial condition of the city as a team effort with the staff and city council. He anticipates a bright future for the city as it continues to nurture new projects like the establishment of the Harriet Tubman National Historical Park, more renewable hydropower, downtown economic development projects and the construction of a new public safety complex.

Mayor Michael D. Quill stated that the city will be sorry to see Selby go. "In my career with the City of Auburn as Fire Chief and now as Mayor I have worked with 9 City Managers and Doug Selby is the best of them all. He has served us extremely well."

Selby was first appointed as Auburn's City Manager on August 29, 2011. His original employment contract was renewed in July of 2014 for a term that lasted through December 31, 2017.
