Memorial to Cayuga County Soldiers & Sailors of the Civil War 1861-1865  
The stone monument reads: Dedicated on July 3, 1988 the 125th anniversary of Gettysburg July 1, 2, 3, 1863 – in memory of the 1st N.Y. Independent Battery (Cowan’s) for their patriotic valor in 36 Civil War battles including the siege of Yorktown, Gettysburg July 3 and Appomattox Court House. The Civil War era cannons are C. A. & Co. T. J. R. 1863 - No. 304 and No. 326.

This monument was placed in memory of those killed on 9/11/01 during the terrorist attacks. The granite is in the shape of the Pentagon building and was sourced near Shanksville, PA. The I-beam was acquired from the Twin Towers that were located in New York City .

The Memorial trees located along Grover St. were planted in memory of Auburn firemen Lt. Alfred H. Murphy, Anthony Contrera and John F. Searing, killed in the line of duty on March 30, 1960 in an explosion at a service station on the corner of Lincoln & South St.
