All Garbage/Trash and Recyclables must be placed curbside AFTER 5:00 p.m. the day prior to collection and BEFORE 7:00 a.m. on collection day. DO NOT PUT TRASH IN CARDBOARD BOXES OR BLACK BAGS.

★ ★ Place recycling containers away from trash containers. ★ ★

Solid Waste Management Center (SWMC) Notes

- ◆ DO NOT USE CARDBOARD BOXES FOR TRASH CONTAINERS.
- ◆ Only waste originating from that particular property can be placed curbside for collection.
- ◆ For residential collection, waste containers should be no larger than 35-gallon with a maximum of 5 containers. 55-gallon drums or containers without handles are unsuitable for curbside collection and will be removed.
- ◆ Landfill stickers are available at the Landfill Office Monday-Friday: 7 am - 2:30 pm.
- ◆ City issued landfill stickers are mandatory for Landfill access. Bulk items will be accepted subject to any applicable Freon extraction rate. ALL LOADS MUST BE TARPED AND SECURED.

Newspaper*

DO NOT RECYCLE IN PLASTIC BAGS

Recycle:

- ◆ Phone Books/Hard Cover Books
- ◆ Magazines
- ◆ Catalogs
- ◆ All clean newspaper, including all inserts delivered
- ◆ In brown paper grocery bags OR
- ◆ Bundled with twine
- ◆ Combine with glass, plastic and metal in one container

Do Not Recycle:

- ◆ Junk Mail

Glass Containers*

DO NOT RECYCLE IN PLASTIC BAGS

Recycle:

- ◆ Clean glass from food and beverage sources that is clear, green, or brown
- ◆ Combine with metal, plastic and newspaper in one container

Do Not Recycle:

- ◆ Any type of broken glass
- ◆ Crystal/mirrors
- ◆ Light bulbs
- ◆ Plate glass
- ◆ Cookware/Pyrex

Metal Containers*

DO NOT RECYCLE IN PLASTIC BAGS

Recycle:

- ◆ Clean food and juice cans
- ◆ Clean aluminum foil
- ◆ Labels removed and containers flattened, if possible
- ◆ Combine with glass, plastic and newspaper in one container

Plastic Containers*

DO NOT RECYCLE IN PLASTIC BAGS

Recycle:

- ◆ **through 7** Plastic ONLY
- ◆ Crush milk & water containers if possible
- ◆ Combine with glass, metal and newspaper in one container

Do Not Recycle:

- ◆ Any other number plastic

*Co-Mingle

Needles, Syringes, Lancets, other Sharps & Unusual Waste

- ◆ Please call your prescribing physician for disposal

Household Hazardous Waste: (Pesticides, oil-based paints, cleaners, etc.)

- ◆ Contact the Cornell Cooperative Extension (255-1183) for disposal details and options.

Cardboard

DO NOT RECYCLE IN PLASTIC BAGS

ALL CARDBOARD MUST BE FLATTENED & TIED or CONTAINERIZED

Recycle:

- ◆ Corrugated boxes; paper grocery bags, boxes such as: cereal, cracker, cake mix, pasta, shoe and tissue boxes; paper egg cartons
- ◆ Must be tied or containerized

Do Not Recycle:

- ◆ Pizza boxes
- ◆ No wax or plastic coated boxes
- ◆ Plastic Liners
- ◆ Leftover food
- ◆ Boxes from wet food, such as ice cream, frozen food, or take out

NOTICE:

ALL CARDBOARD MUST BE FLATTENED.

You may recycle corrugated boxes; paper grocery bags, cereal, cracker, cake mix, pasta, shoe and tissue boxes; paper egg cartons. Remove plastic liners. Flatten ALL cardboard. Pieces must be no larger than 4 ft. x 4 ft. x 1.5 ft. high for curbside pickup. Tie or put in recycling bin. No wax or plastic-coated boxes, wood, plastic or string. No leftover food. No boxes from wet foods, such as ice cream, frozen foods or take-out foods.

Bagged Yard Debris (Monday Pick Up)

Grass and Rakings:

- ◆ Bagged grass and bagged yard clippings/rakings will be collected on Mondays throughout the year.
- ◆ Backyard composting is recommended, OR
- ◆ Placed into separated containers, or clear bags.
- ◆ Grass clippings, leaves and brush may be dropped off at the landfill at no additional charge if you have a city resident landfill decal. You will also be able to use the chipped material for personal use.

Leaves:

- ◆ Backyard composting is recommended, OR
- ◆ Bagged leaves or leaves in separate containers placed at the curb will be picked up on Mondays.
- ◆ Leaves may not be raked to the curb. All leaves must be bagged in an approved bag and tied. Raking leaves to the curb is prohibited and may result in fines or separate collection charges that will be billed to the property owner.

Sticks and Bundled Brush:

◆ Will be picked up by the Public Works Dept. every second week during the months of May thru November.
ALL WASTE SHOULD BE STACKED BETWEEN THE CURB AND SIDEWALK, NOT IN THE STREET. NO CALL BACKS

- ◆ Land clearing debris that does not meet the following standards cannot be placed curbside. Removal is the responsibility of the homeowner or independent contractor.
- ◆ Only materials 4 inches in diameter or less will be collected.
- ◆ All materials are to be cut into lengths of 4 feet or less.
- ◆ Only brush originating on that particular property will be collected.
- ◆ Yard waste (twigs/clippings) must be bagged or containerized, and will be collected on Mondays throughout the year.
- ◆ Stumps and other tree materials over 4 inches in diameter are the responsibility of the property owner for disposal.

Construction/Demolition Material

- ◆ **LIMITED COLLECTION:** In accordance with Chapter 72 of the Municipal Code, the City will collect up to 2 containers of construction/demolition debris per week. Material must be in an approved container and cannot exceed 50 pounds per container. Larger quantities of the debris may be disposed of at the Landfill for a fee. Construction/Demolition waste includes, but is not limited to sheet rock, brick, lumber, and roofing material. In addition, no collection service will be provided for rocks, soil, concrete or stumps.

Bulk Grass/Leaves....	\$20/ton or \$1.00/100 lbs (no charge for City Residents)
Bulk Recyclables	\$20/ton or \$1.00/100 lbs (min. charge \$1.00)
Bagged Asbestos.....	\$140/ton
Asbestos Containing C&D	\$140/ton

SNOW, ICE AND SLUSH REMOVAL

According to Section 44-6 of the Municipal Code of the City of Auburn, the owner, occupant or lessee of any lot or lands adjoining any public sidewalk shall keep the sidewalk free from snow, ice and slush. The snow, ice and slush must be removed within 24-hours following any storm depositing such materials. Any dangerous sidewalk conditions or any accident resulting from these conditions is the liability of the property owner.

Failure to comply with these ordinances may result in fines and penalties. In the event City of Auburn forces must clean snow, ice or slush or have to cut grass, weeds or shrubs to bring the premises into compliance, the property owner will be billed for these services.

GRASS, SHRUB, TREE AND HEDGE TRIMMING

According to Chapter 259, Section 38 of the Municipal Code of the City of Auburn, it is unlawful for any owner or occupant or person having control of any lot or land to allow the growth of grass or weeds to a greater height than six inches. This includes the accumulation of dead grass, weeds and brush. It is also the responsibility of the property owner to maintain the portion of grass located between the sidewalk and the curbing or roadway. This includes around light poles, street signs, etc. Also, it is prohibited to allow hedges, shrubs, or trees to encroach onto public sidewalks and lines of sight of public roadways.

CITY RESIDENT SPRING 2013 SATURDAY LANDFILL DROP-OFF PROGRAM

- Must have a current City resident landfill permit to participate.
- All recyclable material allowed at no cost.
- One trip per Saturday, April through June, a total of 13 Saturdays.
- All loads must be tarped or they will be refused service.
- Tires, Freon containing units, furniture, asbestos, roofing shingles, mattresses etc. are **not** included in the program and must be paid for separately.
- Three bags or cans of garbage allowed at no cost.
- All material must be containerized.
- No construction and demolition material accepted in the program.
- Participants will be directed to a specific area to dispose of the refuse included in the program.

All refuse will be free of charge except the following:

- Any Freon containing items (\$45.00 each)
- Televisions and electronics (\$10.00 each)
- Tires (\$10.00 each)


Items not accepted:

- Any hazardous waste, including asbestos
- Liquid waste, including motor oil, cooking oil, grease, etc.
- Oil based paint cans
